
Selma Burke; Missionary Debra Brown-Bessie Coleman.



March is **Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month (DDAM)!**

Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month was first recognized by President Ronald Reagan in 1987.

Developmental disabilities are defined as impairments in physical, learning, language or behavior areas, and include:

- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Cerebral Palsy
- Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder
- Learning or Intellectual Disabilities
- Hearing loss
- Vision Impairment
- Other Developmental Delays.



DDAM was created to increase public awareness regarding the needs of those living with disabilities. The National Association of Councils on Developmental Disabilities has been on the forefront of advocating for the inclusion and representation of people with developmental disabilities. Further, people with developmental disabilities have been made numerous contributions to society. Learn about a few below:

Haben Girma, J.D. is a disability right lawyer and the first Deafblind person to graduate from Harvard Law School.
